Hade Edge Village Consultation

Dear Resident, the time has come, and some of you may already be aware that a new development plan has been lodged with Kirklees for the land opposite the chapel on Dunford Road. Some residents were alerted to this with a targeted mail questionnaire from Savills' of Manchester. The replies to that maildrop were collated into a "statement of community involvement" even though it was not branded as such.

The HEFF committee consider that the question material was extremely one sided and loaded in the favour of the developer. We are therefore asking for your help to provide feedback about the questionnaire, and further to give you a chance to provide your views in an alternative format to the Savills' document. (see below image)

We would also like to extend an invitation for a follow up public meeting to inform you of progress to date, and how we need to pull together once more to stop this unsustainable development. The Football club will be the venue, 4th June will be the date, and 7:30pm will be the time. HEFF will give a brief overview of the last 12 months hard work, and outline what we all need to do from here. PLEASE MAKE SURE YOU CAN ATTEND.
